Appalachian M&A continues to simmer bringing change to the basin. Most recently in August, EOG Resources announced they closed the \$5.8 billion acquisition of Encino Acquisition Partners. In early July, EQT Corporation announced they closed the \$1.8 billion acquisition of Olympus Energy. And earlier this year, CNX Resources Corporation announced they closed the \$505 million acquisition of the natural gas upstream and midstream business of Apex Energy II, LLC.

Also, earlier this year, Infinity Natural Resources (INR) made their initial public offering (IPO) on the New York Stock Exchange (NYSE). INR's IPO made history as the first West Virginia-based company to be listed on the NYSE. Many congrats to a long-standing supporter of the MLBC for their success!

Until next time, I hope to see you at one of the upcoming events soon!





September Quarterly Board Meeting - Fort Worth, Texas

The AAPL held its September Quarterly Board Meeting in Fort Worth, Texas, where its headquarters are located. The Directors' Roundtable took place on Saturday morning and was well attended. This forum provides an excellent opportunity to share items of interest among chapter directors, raise new topics for discussion, and build stronger connections across our local associations.

One topic of importance was encouraging local chapter members to also become AAPL members. Local chapters that are leading in cross membership have approximately 70-80% of their members enrolled with AAPL. The MLBC currently stands below that number. Tell us a little about yourself.

I am an attorney and have been practicing law for more than 20 years. I live in Upper St. Clair, Pennsylvania, and I am married (to Aleen) with two children (George and Grace). My kids are both away at college, so we are empty nesters at the moment!

Who are you currently employed or contracted with?

I am a Managing Member of Atencio Hall, PLLC. My partner Chris Hall and I launched our firm in 2021 just as things were opening up after Covid. In that time, we have expanded our reach into many areas of law to include business transactions, real estate, estates and trusts, and litigation.

How long have you worked in the oil and gas industry? And what states do you have experience? And tell us about any other land organization you belong.

I have worked in the oil and gas industry for the over 17 years. I started out working with independent oil and gas operators to raise capital through private offerings and later focused on supporting land teams with title opinions. I am experienced in all legal aspects of upstream development including leasing and title, unitization, curative and transactions.



He has argued before the Ohio 7th District Court of Appeals and recently won an appeal on an Ohio Dormant Mineral Act case.






